

CREATE Research Teams Featured in the 4th Run of the Lean LaunchPad@Singapore Programme

16th October 2015: The Lean LaunchPad@Singapore (LLP@SG) is a 10 week entrepreneurial learning programme conducted by NUS Enterprise and adapted from the US NSF's I-Corps programme. This initiative helps researchers move their technological inventions from their labs to the commercial marketplace, and it has recently concluded its 4th run with a Presentation Day at Block 71, Singapore's very own Start-Up hub.

The 2015 edition of the LLP@SG programme featured three CREATE teams consisting of postgraduate students, research fellows and lead Principal Investigators from NEW, a research partnership between Nanyang Technological University, the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and Ben Gurion University of the Negev (see below for team composition). They are: *Project 'SilenBac'* (who has developed chemical compounds for coatings that can reduce the attachment of harmful bacteria on the surface of medical equipment), *Project 'Halal Test'* (who worked on establishing an easy test for meat contamination in food products), and *Project 'PumpTech'* (who has developed a pump that could deliver stable flow rates and yet be as small as a dollar coin). All three projects are between TRL 2-4, and one of these teams is planning to apply for Proof-of-Concept grants to refine their product after filing for IP protection.
